The following are important requirements that apply to ALL photographs taken:

- -Take the pictures in the daylight hours when the color of the graphics looks the most vibrant and true.
- -Be sure that there are no shadows covering any of the graphics when you take the pictures. It is okay if there is some shadows on parts of the care where there are no decals.
- -Make sure that the part of the car being photographed fills the entire frame of the picture (bumper to bumper), which means you will be getting as close to the car as possible to keep the graphics within the frame.
- -We do not recommend zooming in, you should get the camera as physically close as possible as this usually will capture fine details better when close up.
- -Be sure you camera is set to take the highest resolution image possible. When we enlarge these to get the details, low resolution images become very grainy or fussy and are unusable.
- -Be sure that that when your take the pictures, you take it from the most direct, straight, and level position possible. Although the graphics of the are 2D, the car is essentially a 3D object, and in order to produce the best decals possible, the photos taken have appear as 2D as possible (meaning no angles and get down to the level of the graphics being photographed, don't take the picture if you are standing above them and looking down.)

List of the pictures we need:

- 1. A picture of the entire driver side of the car.
- 2. A picture of the entire passenger side of the car.
- 3. A picture of the entire front of the car.
- 4. A picture of the entire rear of the car. (All of the above images will be used to insure proper distancing of the decals as well as duplicate the lighting and other details if you are having us do a complete custom model.)
- 5. A picture of EACH of the non-word graphics (badge, city logo, flags, unit numbers, ect.) that may be on the car.
- 6. Be sure to photograph any front and rear license plates at extreme close so we can also duplicate it.
- 7. Also make sure to take a picture of the cars roof for roof numbers and antenna placement.
